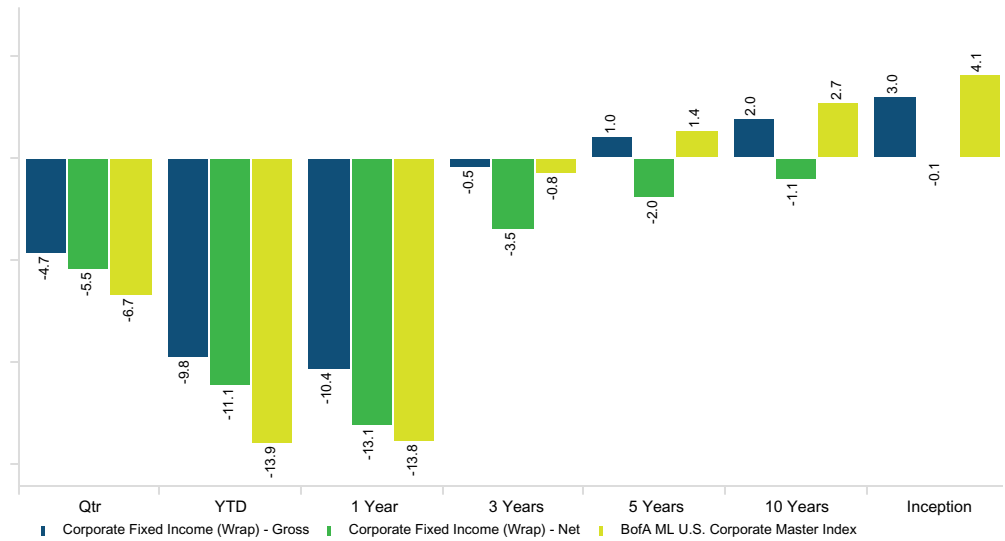

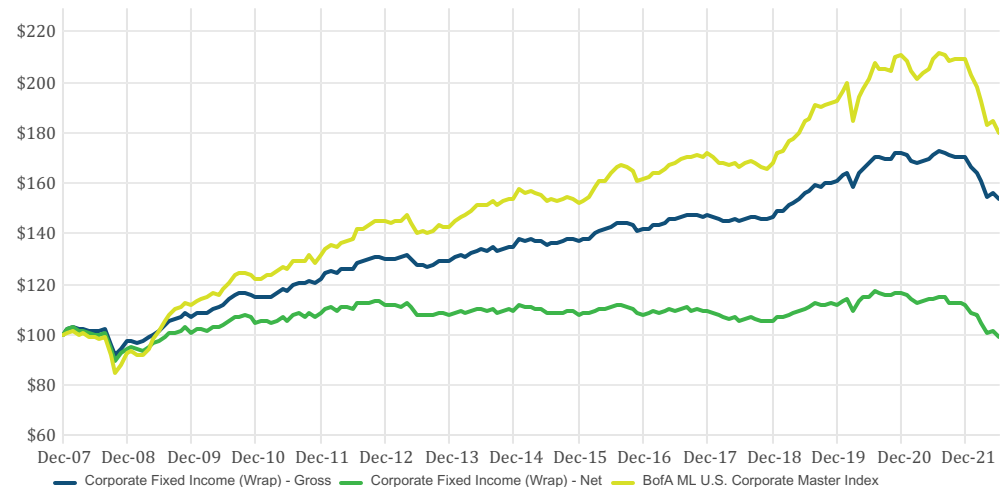

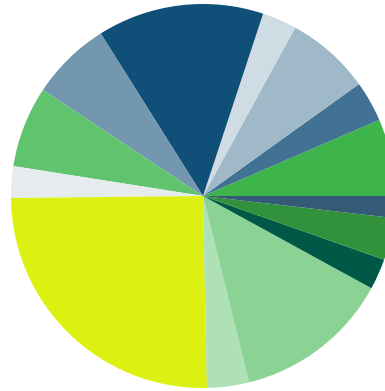
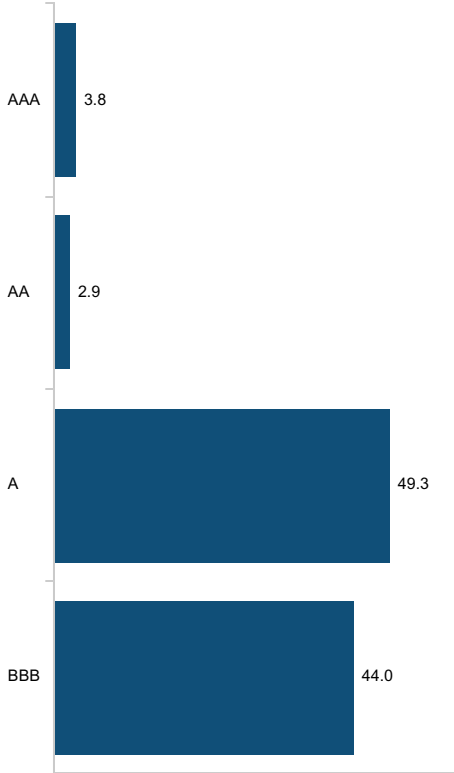

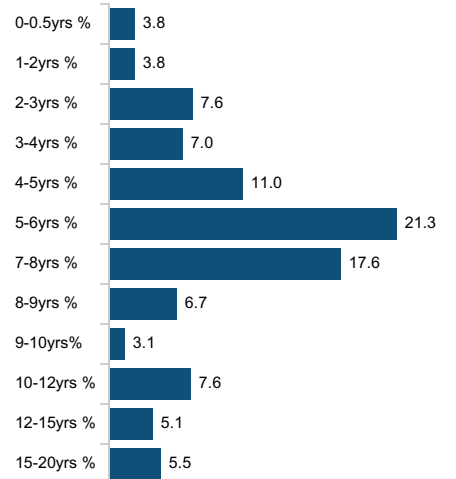
Model Portfolio Fixed Income Sector Breakdown*

Model Portfolio Credit Rating Breakdown*

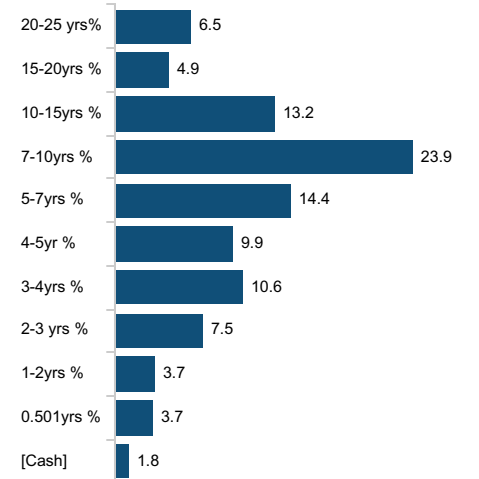

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The Crossmark Corporate Fixed Income Wrap strategy consists of portfolios that are invested solely in corporate bonds. The Crossmark Corporate Fixed Income Wrap Composite was created on January 1, 2008 and consists of all discretionary, fee paying wrap accounts managed using this strategy. The primary benchmark for this composite is the Bank of America Merrill Lynch Corporate Master Index. The Bank of America Merrill Lynch Corporate Master tracks the performance of U.S. dollar denominated investment grade corporate debt publicly issued in the U.S. domestic market.

The U.S. Dollar is the currency used to express performance. The performance reflects the reinvestment of dividends and other earnings to the extent that client accounts included in the composite elected to reinvest dividends and earnings. Performance figures shown gross of fees do not reflect the payment of investment advisory fees.

Fixed income investments generally involve three principal risks—interest rate risk, credit risk, and liquidity risk. Prices of fixed-income securities rise and fall in response to interest rate changes (interest rate risk). Generally, when interest rates rise, prices of fixed-income securities fall. The longer the duration of the security, the more sensitive the security is to this risk. There is also a risk that the issuer of a note or bond will be unable to pay agreed interest payments and may be unable to repay the principal upon maturity (credit risk). Lower-rated bonds, and bonds with longer final maturities, generally have higher credit risks.
