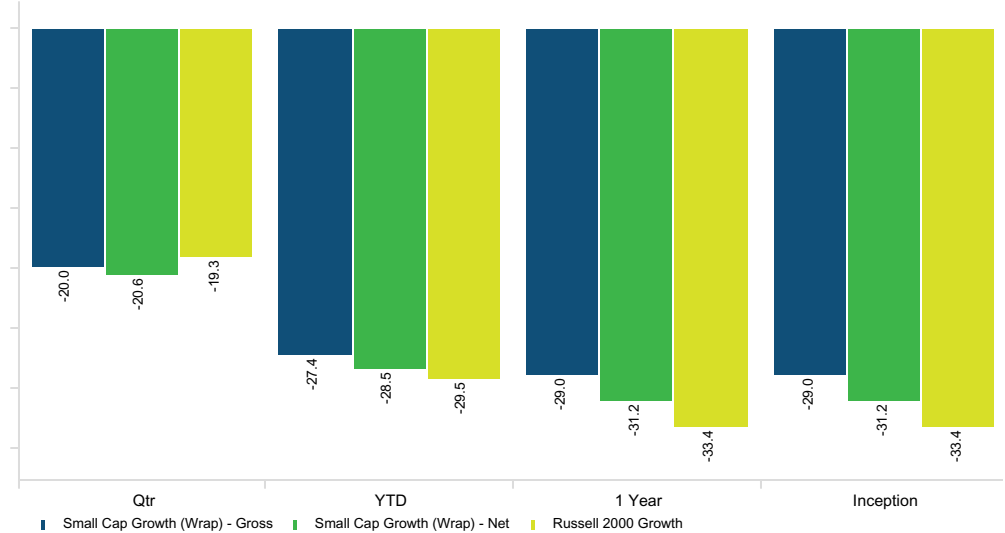

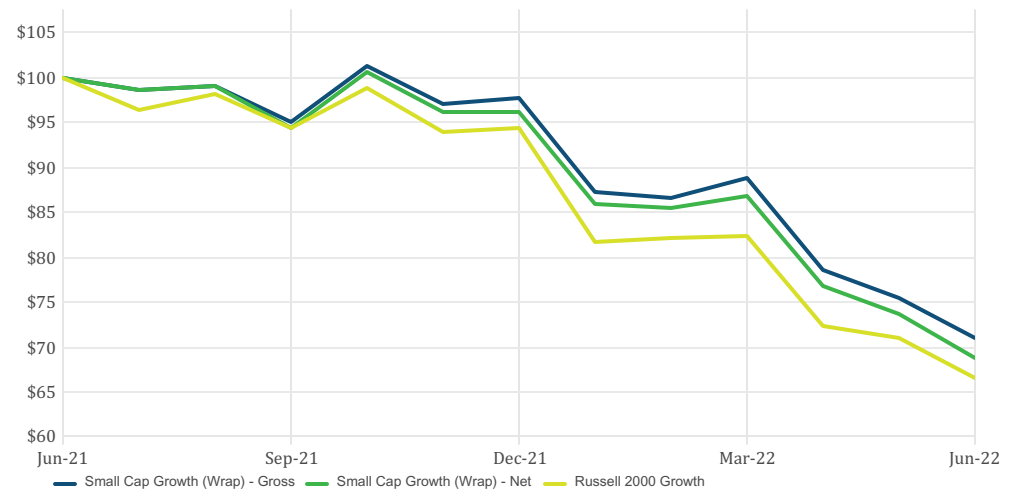

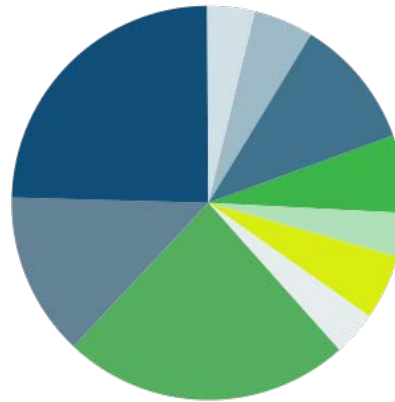

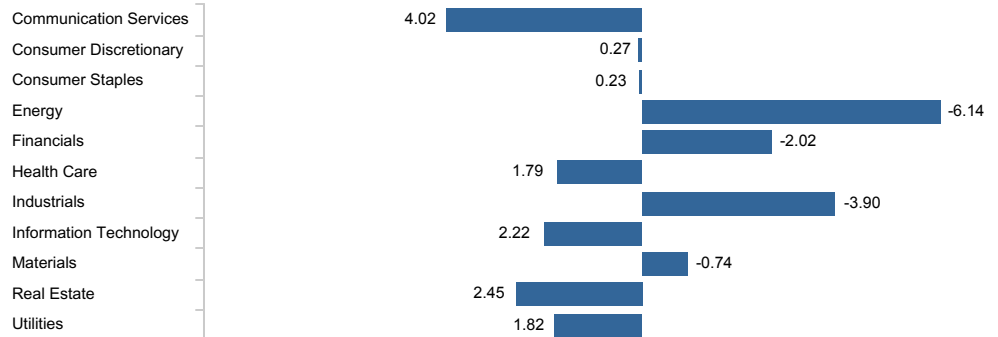

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The Crossmark Small Cap Growth Strategy consists of accounts primarily invested in small-cap U.S. equity securities with an emphasis on growth. The Small Cap Growth Wrap Composite was created on July 1, 2021, and consists of all discretionary fee-paying wrap accounts managed using this strategy. The primary benchmark for this composite is Russell 2000 Growth Index. The Russell 2000® Growth Index measures the performance of the large cap growth segment of the US equity universe. It includes those Russell 2000 companies with relatively higher price-to-book ratios, higher I/B/E/S forecast medium term (2 year) growth and higher sales per share historical growth (5 years).

The U.S. Dollar is the currency used to express performance. The performance reflects the reinvestment of dividends and other earnings to the extent that client accounts included in the composite elected to reinvest dividends and earnings. Performance figures shown gross of fees do not reflect the payment of investment advisory fees.
